

# 2015-2016 Program Highlights

## **Big Brothers Big Sisters**

Big Brothers Big Sisters Smart Program paired 37 high school and middle school students with elementary aged students in order to provide bonding opportunities and skill building.

## Middle School and High School Student Boards

Twenty five middle school and seventeen high school students made up the 2015-2016 YSCTC student boards. This diverse group of board members seek to gain a greater understanding and tolerance of others, while gaining leadership qualities to bring about positive change.

## Cathy Shaffer Above & Beyond & Turnaround Awards

YS CTC awarded three Above & Beyond Awards in the Spring of 2016 to recognize those middle and high school student who exemplify the CTC mission. In addition, six students were recognized with Turnaround Awards for positively turning around their actions and behaviors during the 2015-2016 school year.

## **New Family Inclusion**

New Family Inclusion is a program which provides information and support to ease the transition for new families coming into York Suburban School District. Thirty eight families were contacted during the 2015-2016 school year.

## Kids in the Kitchen

Partnering with Memorial Hospital, the Kids in the Kitchen program brought skill building, nutritional education, and fun to all third grade classes in the spring of 2016.

## National Night Out

Our National Night Out participation provides support as we work to foster the relationship between law enforcement and our community.

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#### **Community Variety Show**

The CTC Community Variety Show is our signature event that provides the opportunity to bring our community and schools together through prosocial involvement. At the 2015 show, we had 33 performers participate and over 450 in attendance for the show.

#### **Dodgeball Tournament**

Organized by the CTC High School Student Board, the Dodgeball Tournament provides the opportunity for prosocial involvement for our high school aged students. Eleven teams of eight students fought it out for a fun night for all!

### **Multicultural Festival**

The Multicultural Festival is a prosocial event housed in the York Suburban Middle School which provides diversity education and prosocial community involvement. Ten countries were represented with ethnic food, crafts and games, and three groups provided musical and dance entertainment.

### Wellness Fair & Fun Run

Working in collaboration with the YS Wellness committee, YSCTC organized a wellness fair and fun run to provide prosocial involvement and wellness education in May 2016.

### **Drug Education**

In May 2016, the senior class attended an assembly focused on opiate and heroin education in coordination with the York County Heroin Task Force.

#### **Pennsylvania Youth Survey**

In the fall of 2015, the Pennsylvania Youth Survey was given to 6th, 8th, 10th, and 12th grade York Suburban students. During the coming year, CTC will be evaluating the results from this survey to determine the risk factors facing our youth, and establishing programming to protect them.
